



Lena Moliero

April 16, 1948 - January 9, 2019

Lena Moliero, a sought-after legal secretary and project manager at some of New York City's most powerful law firms for almost 50 years, but best remembered as a smiling beacon of positivity and love to her large family and legions of friends, died Wednesday, Jan. 9, 2019, at Staten Island University Hospital South, surrounded by her loving family. She was 70.

Born Lena Masella on April 16, 1948, in the small town of Cantalupo in southern Italy, she emigrated to America with her parents, Antonio and Anna Masella, and her siblings, Joe and Fran, in 1957. Little Lena was just 9 years old and could speak no English when the family settled near Prospect Park, Brooklyn. They later lived for about five years in Flatbush.

The youngest of the three Masella children, Lena was often the most responsible, and "always seemed to know what to do," recalled her daughter, Kathryn.

Lena met her beloved husband of 48 years, Joe Moliero, in 1967 on a blind date. He had just returned from Vietnam. Joe worked in a mailroom with Lena's cousin Vinny, who decided to try to set them up. Three years later they were married and honeymooning in Bermuda.

The young couple moved to Great Kills, Staten Island, in 1976. They raised their children Michael and Kathryn in a warm two-family home on Armstrong Avenue, and when the time came, Kathryn and her husband, Alex Duenas, elected to raise their family -- Lena's beloved grandchildren Jeremy and Michaela -- in the same place, upstairs.

Alex, like Lena, was an immigrant. And Lena, a master of Italian cooking, made sure to learn how to cook Ecuadorian dishes -- especially her son-in-law's favorite, cerviche de cameron -- to make him feel at home. And even though Kathryn told her not to, she would often go out and buy Alex's favorite Spanish cheese and rice pudding.

The Moliero home for decades was the center of the annual family ritual of jarring the tomato sauce. Dozens of family members and neighbors would gather over a late August weekend and form an assembly line in the backyard, where they'd rinse, boil, crush, and bottle more than 100 crates of fresh plum tomatoes so that all the participating families would leave with a year's supply. But it wasn't just about making superb sauce; it was about laughing, feasting, drinking and enjoying each other's company, one weekend every year, come what may. And Lena was always at the center of the production -- ensuring quality control, making sure people were fed and the coolers full, and keeping talmudic notes in her marble notebook on that year's yield and other notable happenings. And there were always notable happenings.

It was this meticulous attention to detail that led to Lena's great success in the legal world, where she entered the workforce immediately upon graduating John Jay High School. With her newly-learned shorthand skills, 100-words-a-minute-plus typing ability, and unmatched spelling and vocabulary (Lena, a great reader, had mastered the English language quickly), she landed a job with Thatcher, Proffitt and Wood on Wall Street in 1966. She worked her way up from legal secretary to project manager during almost 30 years at the firm, which later moved to World Trade Center South. She had already left when it was destroyed on 9/11.

After working briefly at Hawkins, Delafield and Wood, Lena settled in at the highly respected law firm of Hughes, Hubbard and Reed downtown in 1994. She worked there for 20 years, and was constantly in demand among the partners. "Everybody wanted Lena as their secretary," Kathryn recalled.

Lena vowed to retire when she turned 66 in 2014, after 20 years as Hughes Hubbard, and she did. But she missed her commute -- "the ferry ride with the girls," her daughter said.

That is not to say Lena did not enjoy her retirement. She did, immensely. It meant more time with her cherished family, longer walks at the beach with the dog Bobby she "inherited" from her grandson, and traveling the world with Joe. They went to Italy almost a half dozen times, and visited parts of Europe, and the Caribbean, Hawaii and California.

Among the most special trips were the ones Lena and Joe, a retired MTA train operator, took every year to meet Joe's buddies from the Vietnam War. The veterans of the 11th Armored Cavalry would gather in a different city annually, and the Molieros became friendly with several other couples. They would go on cruises and trips to the islands together. They all wanted to eat Lena's famous, fresh tomato sauce. So one year, Lena shipped six jars of sauce ahead to St. John, where they were renting a house. It was an

expensive proposition and Lena decided next time they'd have to settle for a supermarket brand.

Lena loved to joke, to laugh, to be around friends and family. She drew people to her because she was a positive presence, her daughter remembered, who never judged. She will be dearly missed.

Lena was the loving mother of Michael Moliero and Kathryn Duenas; the fond mother-in-law of Alex Duenas; the dear sister of Joe and Joyce Masella, Fran and Tony Peccia and Judy Moliero; and the devoted grandmother of Jeremy and Michaela Duenas. Lena is also survived by many loving nieces, nephews, great nieces and nephews, and many friends. She also leaves behind her "walking buddy," Bobby.

The family will receive friends from 2-5 and 7-9 p.m. on Friday, Jan. 11, 2019, at John Vincent Scalia Home for Funerals, 28 Eltingville Blvd, Staten Island, New York. A Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated at 9:45 a.m. on Saturday, Jan. 12, 2019 at St. Clare Church, 110 Nelson Ave, Staten Island, New York. Burial will follow in Forest Green Memorial Park Cemetery, Morganville, NJ.


