S. V. VENKATESH, 80, passed away on Thursday April 30, 2020 at his home in Staten Island, NY surrounded by his loving family.

Born April 1, 1940 in Mysuru, India, Venkatesh credited his interest in his eventual career in engineering to his father Venkataramaiah , who was a engineer who built dams across India.

An Electrical Engineering graduate of Mandya (P.E.S.) Engineering College, Venkatesh worked on engineering projects in northern India before moving back to his home state of Karnataka to marry his dear wife, Nagarathna.

The young couple lived in K.G.F, Karnataka for several years, where Venkatesh worked as a engineer in the gold mining city, with his young family, his sister, and his beloved mother.

Venkatesh, his wife, and two young children left India in 1980, to move to New York, USA. After residing in the culturally vibrant neighborhood of Jackson Heights, Queens for several years, Venkatesh and his family then settled down in Staten Island in 1985, where he lived until his passing.

Venkatesh worked with the NYCTA, where he contributed to a number of transit improvement projects until his retirement in 2014. He had established a strong social network in his 33 years with the NYCTA and he maintained these connections throughout his whole life.

Always an avid member of his community, Venkatesh was deeply involved in the Kannada

Koota, a way for him to maintain a connection to his first homeland. A wearer of many hats within the organization, Venkatesh could be found acting, serving meals, working on various committees, or just joking around with his many friends.

After retirement, Venkatesh found new purpose in taking care of his beloved grandchildren, writing and publishing three books in his native Kannada, and of course, crafting new jokes to share with his many family and friends. He wrote his translation of the Ramayana, the Mahabharatha, and the Bhagavatham with help from his sister Manjula and the late MG Prasad.

Venkatesh noted on his 80th birthday, celebrated just a few weeks ago, that he found the symmetry in his life compelling; that he spent the first half of his life in India, and the other half in the United States.

Venkatesh passed away on April 30, 2020, surrounded by his loving family in his Annadale home. He leaves behind his cherished wife of 48 years, Nagarathna, his daughter Surabhi Hanubal and son in law Nagesh Hanubal of Newburgh, NY, and son Sughosh Venkatesh and daughter in law Dr. Arathi Setty of Staten Island, as well as his four grandchildren, Suresh, Maanasa, Mahesh, and Akash, who he doted over (seriously, he loved having them around, he lit up whenever he talked about them). He also leaves behind his three sisters, Vani, Manjula, and Indrani, and brother, Guru.

“ Venkatesh was a wonderful and warm presence in our lives. I knew him since my childhood days in Mysuru and my husband came to know him after our wedding. In Staten Island we were “practically neighbors” as he always said, and both he and Ratna were always kind and hospitable to us. One of our fondest memories of him is linked to the abundant kindness he showed us during those years, which I think exemplifies his generosity and humility: on dozens of occasions he would drop by in the evening- with piping hot food. He always said “I was making chutneys and I thought of you”, or “Krishnan really likes my idlis and sambhar so I made extra”. The food was delicious of course, but for the two of us, who often returned from work late, there was an added poignancy. Fresh food, cooked with love, and delivered when we least expected it: this was reminiscent of being home in India and being cared for by family. I know that this simplicity and concern for others was just a part of him: we saw that everyone from nurses in the hospital to relative strangers he met at the temple were touched by his kindness and openness. His departure is a great loss and we convey our deepest condolences to Ratna, Cheeni, Surabhi and family. May Bhagavan give you the strength to endure this loss. He was a punyatma in whose life our dharma, prayer and service were important. We pray to Narayana that our dear friend should have a good gati.

S.V. Venkatesh Eulogy

I have mourned for my father twice.

The first time was sixteen years ago when he went in for what we knew was a critical heart operation. We thought he may not make it. I thought, if he did, he would have, at best, months of debilitation and struggle. I mourned him because I thought he was gone. But I mourned him without really knowing him. I did not know him. I felt towards him almost as much as I did when I was a small boy holding his hand while we walked home. He was my father, a part of my life but with no volition of his own, like the sun or mountain on the horizon. I did not know him.

When I lost my job in California, I wanted to return to him because, as a child would, I wanted his comfort. I wanted him to make everything better. And that's when he was a hair's breadth from being taken himself. I mourned him and I was selfish.

After I moved back, but really more after I got married and had children of my own, did I get to know him. When we went to the Taj Mahal, we went on a Friday, a day that it's closed. So we had to see it from a distance, from the back. But that day, for whatever reason my dad salvaged the day, salvaged the memory of that day, by buying ice cream for a number of children who were just playing in the area. Soon he had purchased ice cream for nearly every child in the village. Kids came running and he gave them all a coin for the cone. That is what I remember from that day.

I began to see him and the decision he made. He studied for the PE himself and never passed. But when I was studying, he would bring me coffee and share his books. When I visited his work place, everyone would tell me what a kind and caring man he was. When I started working, I realized how truly unusual that was.

When my baby was sick, he would volunteer to come and take care of us so we could do our jobs without disruption. And if I sometimes became angry and yelled at my little boy because he did something that little boys may do, he would counsel that I stay calm. It's not like he never yelled at us, but I know that whenever he did he felt horrible afterwards. So the counsel was as much to protect me as to shield my son.

Mark Twain once remarked, when I was 16 I thought my father was the most ignorant man on the planet. But by the time I turned 21, I was astonished at how much he had learned.

I rather feel like that now. I feel like I got to know him, not just as the father figure in an abstract emotional way I once must have done. But a person who made a thousand decision and almost everyone one to help his family, his friends, his coworkers, his nurses and doctors, basically everyone who he came in contact with. And he made a decision to help my family, my children, me by being there and by being there and by being there, doing whatever needed to be done.

So I mourn for him again. I am again heartbroken terrified of the loss, aching for each time when I expect him and he's not there, confused and stumbling whenever a thought of him and it must now be without him. In past tense and not future. I had once heard that a true hero is not one who dies nobly for a cause but lives humbly for one.

So today I once again mourn my father, my hero.
