Vincent Triana, 97 of Annadale, passed away on Wednesday, July 22, 2020, at home surrounded by his loving family.

Born Tuesday, January 2, 1923 in Brooklyn, NY, he was the devoted son of the late Vincenzo Triana and Delia Scutari Triana. The youngest of 5 children, Vincent was the dear brother of the late Phyllis, Julia, Kaye, and Anthony.

Vincent met and married his childhood sweetheart Muriel, with whom he celebrated 74 years of love and happiness together. Muriel sadly passed away in 2017. On March 19, 1944 Vincent dutifully and proudly joined the US Army during WWII. Vincent was seriously wounded in Germany and was honorably discharged on July 26, 1945.

Upon his return home to the States Vincent found employment in a diamond dye company, then as a US Postal Carrier, before beginning his long standing career as a member of the FDNY in 1950. Vincent rose to the rank of Lieutenant and retired on June 19, 1976 after almost 26 years of dedicated service. In his free time and later years, Vincent was a regular and member of the Friendship club of Great Kills, and a active member at the Great Kills Swim Club where he spent many a day playing cards and socializing with his friends.

Vincent loved reading, and trips to Atlantic City, Walking the dogs gave him such pleasure, and spending time with family and friends were his greatest joy.
