



Carmine (Eddie) Morano

June 22, 1936 - May 6, 2016

Carmine 'Eddie' Morano, 79 of Eltingville passed away on Friday May 6, 2016, surrounded by his loving family. Carmine was beloved husband to Camille (nee Sorrentino) for 53 years; loving father of Liz Rogers and her husband Erik, and devoted grandfather to Amanda.

Born in the Little Italy section of Manhattan, he was the son of the late Carmine and Madeline Morano, and the youngest of seven children. He was predeceased by all his siblings – Ralph, James, Frank, Carl, Angie, and Louie. He is survived by many nieces and nephews.

Once married, Carmine and Camille resided in Brooklyn, NY before moving to Staten Island in 1965.

Carmine (Eddie) worked for Ebasco Services in Manhattan for 42 years, before retiring in 1995. He was an active athlete – playing softball on Sunday mornings for S&F Meat Market and The Boys of Summer and weeknights for Ebasco. He was also a PSAL Football official for 25 years, refereeing games in all five boroughs. He is a member of the NYC Stickball Hall of Fame, and has a plaque dedicated to him on Mulberry Street in front of the rectory of Old St. Pat's. He played and managed basketball tournaments in Old St. Pat's.

A Mass of Christian Burial will be offered at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday at Holy Child Church located at 4747 Amboy Rd Staten Island, New York.

Entombment will be in Woodbridge Memorial Gardens, Woodbridge, NJ.
