Carol Ann Hoag (nee Pollock) passed away on February 14, 2024 at the age of 88.

Carol Ann was born and raised in Brooklyn, NY. She married Robert in 1963, and adopted her first child, George, a German Shepherd puppy, shortly thereafter. They later moved to the Annadale section of Staten Island, raised a daughter, and continued to adopt a string of large dogs.

Most of Carol Ann's working life was at the Officers'/Community Club at the Ft. Hamilton Army Base in Brooklyn. She began working there as a secretary during her young single years, and later returned there as a banquet coordinator in the catering department. She formed close bonds with her coworkers, several of whom remained dear friends throughout her life, and she loved the work she did in helping people plan their celebrations.
