I met Eugenio about 20 years ago as we volunteered with Ms. Noemi Figueroa's "The Borinqueneers" film project, which was completed in 2008, and one in which Eugenio was involved, before during and after both as a participant in the film, and as a volunteer in fund-raising events, interviews and other film-related activities.

I will always remember the long talks we had and the many times we rode together, along with his dear wife Virginia - a constant companion - to many of the film and other veterans-related activities. I know he was very proud of the contributions that he made in this regard.

Eugenio took his responsibilities in the film very seriously. He was a loyal and responsible in this regard, even at his advanced age. I admired him greatly for all that. Eugenio recognized that the thoughts and words he expressed regarding the Korean War and the Borinqueneers represented not just himself. He knew he was speaking for all those other Borinqueneers who could not speak for themselves and for all Puerto Ricans who had served in the Korean War and beyond.

Long live the memory of my dear friend, Korean War vet, and Borinqueneer EUGENIO QUEVEDO! A life well-lived, he will not soon be forgotten.

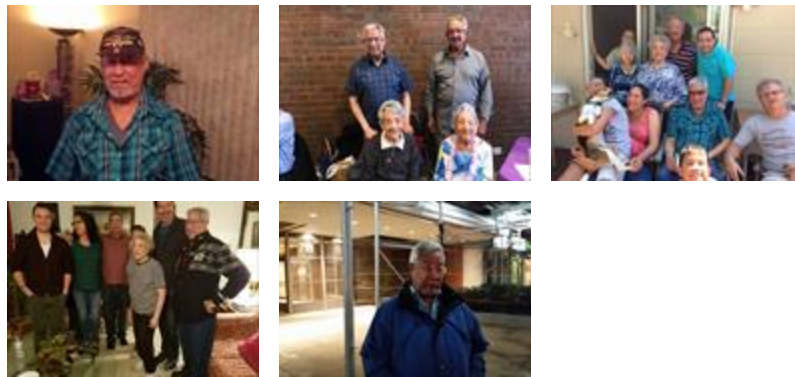
