



## Frank A Bradicich

May 6, 1924 - February 17, 2023

Frank Anthony Bradicich was born on May 6, 1924. Born in Brooklyn, NY to parents Frank Bradicich and Felicia Fiore. Frank had two brothers Joe and John, as well as one sister Barbara.

Due to some family health issues and the impact of the Great Depression, Frank and his siblings were raised in a Catholic orphanage run by the Dominican Sisters of Sparkill at Dominican Convent - roots that led to a lifetime as a devout Catholic.

Frank stayed at the orphanage until age 17, and then joined the Navy during WWII. He served for 4 years and achieved the rank of Electrician's Mate 3rd Class.

After leaving the Navy, he became one of New York's finest, a sworn officer in the NYPD.

Shortly after the start of his career in the NYPD he married his fiance Anne Haran, the love of his life. Shortly after marriage they welcomed their daughter Carol Anne who died 6 days after her father on February 23, 2023.

Following retirement from the NYPD after 20 years, and achieving the rank of Lieutenant, Frank moved to the position of chief of security for Smith-Barney

in Manhattan, where he had a second career of 9 years.

During most of his adult life, and all of his years in the NYPD, Frank attended mass daily. He loved God and loved serving Him in St. Patrick's Roman Catholic Church in Richmondtown, Staten Island, where he served in many roles throughout his years.

He was a lifelong student of the Bible and church history, as well as history in general. Frank was a great conversationalist and teacher on a wide variety of topics.

Frank was an active member of numerous organizations, serving as an officer of some. Those organizations include: The Holy Name Society, The Knights of Columbus, the VFW and other veteran's groups, and The Sparkill Club of which he was president for over 20 years.

Frank was a loving husband, father and grandfather.

Frank is survived by his son in law Frank Sheridan, and granddaughter Catherine Lin Sheridan, and numerous nieces, nephews and friends. He was predeceased by his siblings, Joseph Bradicich, John Bradicich, and Barbara Sweeten, and his granddaughter, Nancy Sheridan.

Was a member of the Police Anchor Club. The Club Sponsored annual trips for the kids at St. Agnes Home and School for Boys in Sparkill, NY to The Palisades Amusement Park in New Jersey, park long closed. I and my two brothers were at St. Agnes from ~ August 1969 to June 1972; we loved going on that trip to the Palisades Amusement Park.
