George Wolf, 92 of New York passed away on Sunday, June 28, 2020, at the Dawn Greene Hospice at Mary Manning Walsh in New York City.

Born Wednesday, November 16, 1927 in Brno Czechoslovakia, he was the son of the late Egon and Trudy Wolf.

George was born in Czechoslovakia in 1927 and remained there until the age of 12. In 1939 George's father Egon moved him to Switzerland at the beginning of the war. George was present in Prague and saw Hitler during Germany's Military Parade.

Residing in Switzerland till 1946, George and his family then moved to NYC where he has been ever since. George met and married the love of his life his wife Beth who sadly passed away.

In 1946 George worked as an interpreter at Nuremberg Trail. He later joined the staff of The Blue Card, a non profit organization aiding destitute Holocaust Survivors. George a businessman in the textile industry lived a long and fulfilled life. He enjoyed reading, travel, and music.

George was adventurous, compassionate and friendly he brightened the lives of all who met and knew him. He will be truly missed by his closest friends and

all who were touched by his gentle and giving soul.

George will be cremated and laid to rest with his wife Beth, where they can be together again on Friday July 3, 2020 11:00 am at Mt. Pleasant Cemetery, 80 Commerce Street, Hawthorne, NY 10532

“George, or as he called himself in Czech Jirka (and in German Schorschi), was a close and one-of-a-kind friend whom I met through his relative George Sachs. I came to New York to conduct interviews with Shoah survivors for The Jewish Museum in Prague, and he was one of them. After I eventually moved to NYC, he was always there for me. When I was going through a challenging life situation George was very compassionate and caring, and gave me a wonderful children’s book with a beautiful dedication written in Czech. I will never forget. We exchanged many letters during those five years I’ve known him. And, I would like to share an excerpt from one letter:

“There are times in all our lives when we think we can’t go on, we can’t handle what is happening to us, we lose all hope, we can’t survive (...) It is not all the vicissitudes that happen to us, the disappointments, the betrayals, the dashed hopes and expectations, it is how we deal with them, how we handle ourselves, how we behave as human beings. And in the end, and there always is an end, there is only one answer, love. Love is the only answer. With love, Jirka”

When I interviewed George, I was impressed with George's life experience. Talking to somebody who saw Hitler in 1939 in Prague, somebody who worked as an interpreter during the Nuremberg Trial in 1946 was a life changing moment. In 2009, the Blue Card received a legacy gift from a Holocaust survivor with property in Brno, Czech Republic, the city George was born. I needed to go to Brno and I remember visiting a few places of his childhood. We always understood each other; even if we were in disagreement, we found a way to solve it. When George asked me five years ago if I would be able to help him carry his Will, it would be an honor for me.

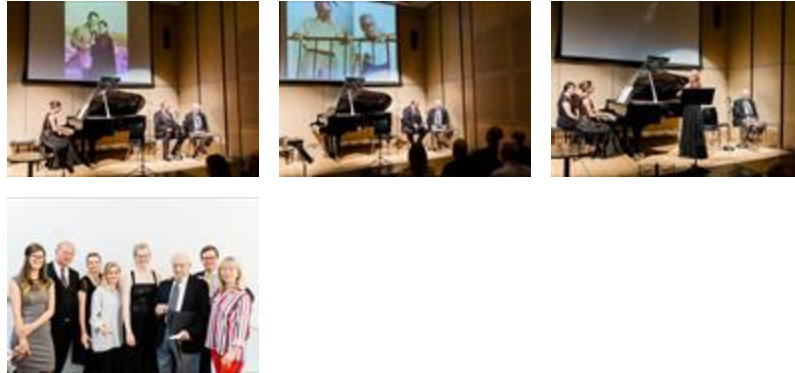
