John Aber of West Brighton, formerly of Huguenot, passed away on Tuesday December 3, 2019 at Staten Island University Hospital surrounded by his loving family. Born in Brooklyn to the late Percy and Jean Aber, John worked for many years as a Captain for the New York City Department of Corrections. After his retirement he began working a second career as a security officer for JP Morgan. He then took a position as head of the security detail for Peter Jennings.

While working for the Department of Corrections John obtained his Associates Degree from New York Technical Institute, he then enrolled in John Jay College of Criminal Justice to further his education.

John was a 4th Degree member of the Knights of Columbus and was Past Grand Knight of Henry Stolzenhaller Council. A long time parishioner of St. Joseph St. Thomas Parish, John volunteered at the Camp St. Edwards Food Pantry working alongside Sister Maria. He coached soccer at St. Joseph St. Thomas, for many years, as well as coaching baseball for the South Shore Little League. John was also a Boy Scout Leader for Troop 4 and a member of the Order of the Arrow with the Boy Scouts of America. He played professional baseball for the New York Giants and developed an wonderful friendship with Willie Mays among others. He was and avid golfer and participated in the Senior Olympics in bowling and golf.

He was a great story teller, even though he might have told you the story once or twice before...

He was predeceased by his wife of 52 years Patricia who passed away on Easter Sunday 2 1/2 years ago. He is survived by his son John and his wife Jennifer, his daughter Tracy Sokol and her husband Seth, his brother Frank and his 3 grandchildren Devan, Daniel and Kimmy.

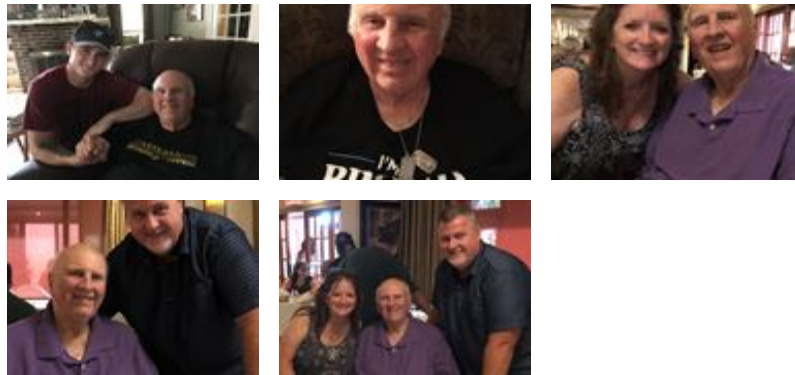
