“ Joe Corapi was an extraordinary person- I worked with Joe and he was dedicated to all he did; a super valuable member of the Staten Island Bridges Team and friend to many...And what a gardener! We bought our house in 1992 and it was sorely in need of landscaping. Joe found out that I could use some gardening help and he would surprise me often through the years with a variety of plants and flowers for my backyard.

Every so often a box wrapped in a brown paper bag would appear on up on my desk and it contained some kind of plant with an envelope tucked inside with the plant name and instructions on how and where and when to add to my garden; and even after Joe retired, he would call me from the SIB parking lot and I would come down and he would open the trunk of his car and there would be a cardboard box with another “Joe Corapi” plant. I could never remember the names so when someone admire my beautiful flower beds and ask me the name, I would say “it’s a Joe Corapi flower”. Even as recently as a few years ago a soggy, brown paper wrapped cardboard box arrived at our house in Chatham, NJ and in it was his last gift of “lovely purple blooms” for our garden.

Joe was one in a million - All who new him will miss him; may he rest in peace and may his flowers be a reminder of the beautiful person he was, he is - Joe Corapi.

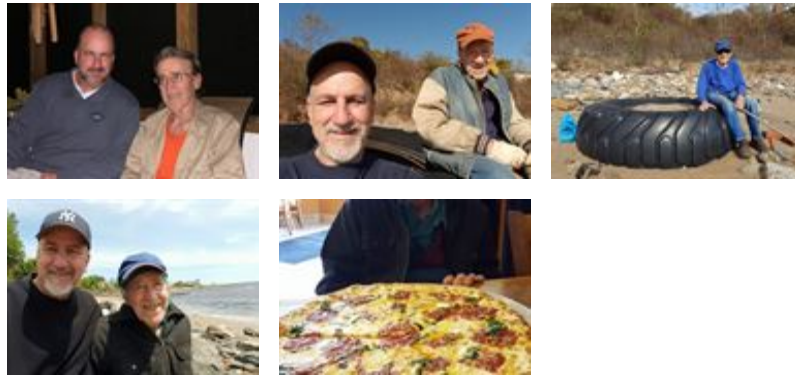
