Kathleen Devine, 94 of Tinton Falls, New Jersey passed away Thursday, December 17, 2020, at her residence surrounded by her loving family.

Born Tuesday, June 8, 1926 in Staten Island, New York, she was the daughter of the late Denis Malone and Catherine Keohane Malone.

Kathleen attended and graduated from St. Peter's Girls High School in Staten Island, NY. For many years she was employed by Perosi Electrical Corp as a bookkeeper.
