Her sense of humor was legendary, and her wit was as sharp as it was endearing. Whether sharing a joke or one of her signature sayings, like "Thanks for showing up, take the rest of the day off with pay," or when asked in passing how she was doing her staple reply would be "Hanging in there like a loose tooth. ". Linda had a unique gift for lifting spirits and bringing laughter to everyday life. She was the family's unofficial Uber driver, constantly on the move, from putting her grandsons on the bus to chauffeuring her sister Colleen around town.

Linda was deeply devoted to her faith, dedicating countless hours to her church community. She served as a reader at Saturday evening Masses, a church sexton, and a fill-in secretary whenever needed, as well as Official Money counter for the Masses and appointed accountant for the churches many accounts. Her commitment to her church was unwavering, and she performed her duties with grace and dedication. 6 am Bagels where a weekly staple at the church rectory with her fellow volunteers and friends, the coffee was already ready when they got there thanks to Linda.

Her compassion extended beyond her family and faith. Linda was known for her generosity, always ready to assist those in need, often giving to those less

fortunate across Staten Island. Her heart knew no bounds, and her kindness was a testament to her character.
