Louis A. Papandrea, 94, passed away on Thursday, May 9, 2024, at his home surrounded by his loving family.

He was the beloved husband of 70 years to Lillian Papandrea. Loving father to Patti Tomasso, Tom Papandrea, Jean Silano and Susan Porzio, dear father-in-law to Vincent Tomasso, Benedette Papandrea, John Silano and Frank Porzio, devoted grandfather to Nicole, Lisa, Vincent, Michael, Christine, Lianne, Rose, Melissa, Frank and Janine. Louis is also survived by his 7 cherished great grandchildren.

Born and raised in Bensonhurst, Brooklyn, Lou served in the Army during the Korean War and later graduated from NYU under the GI bill. He was the family's first college graduate and went on to have a successful career in finance and securities, rising to VP of operations. Lou was a devout Catholic and a member of the Knights of Columbus. His love for God and his family was evident in all he did. In his retirement he spent his time with Lillian travelling and being active in the community. They were active in the Friendship club at Mount Loretto and did volunteer work at SIU Hospital South. They were active members of the SI AARP chapter where he served as Secretary for many years.

Lou was the rock of the Papandrea family and a man of honesty, principle,

and integrity, though that doesn't mean he took things too seriously. Lou loved to joke with and even poke fun at his loved ones - but always in good taste (even if the joke was a little corny or he had already used it countless times before). Like any true man of character, he was the first to laugh at himself and used humor to make those around him feel welcome and loved.

The family would like to extend their heartfelt gratitude to the dedicated caregivers who became an extended family to Lou, providing love, care, and support in his later years. Their kindness and compassion made a significant difference in extending his life, and we are forever grateful.

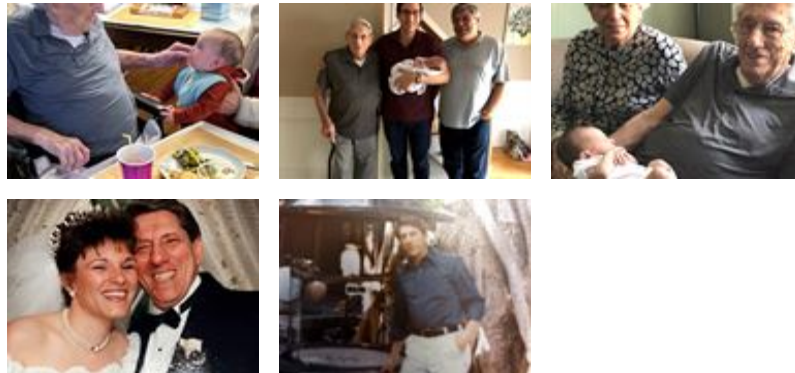

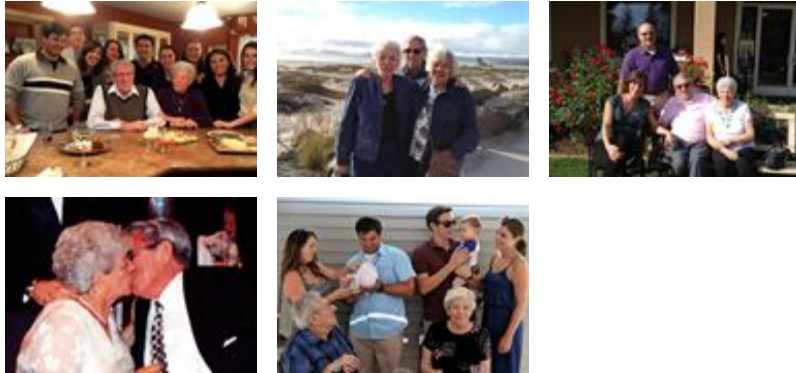
