



Santo "Tom" Pellegrino

April 5, 1932 - April 25, 2020

Santo "Tom" Pellegrino, 88 passed away on Saturday, April 25, 2020, at Richmond University Medical Center after a courageous battle with the Covid-19 Virus.

Born Tuesday, April 5, 1932 in Bronx, New York, he was the son of the late Angelo Pellegrino and the late Josephine Martello Pellegrino.

Tom a US Marine Veteran and Staff Sergeant, during the Korean War, served proudly both active and reserve from 1949-1963. Following his active service Tom became a police officer at the 94th Precinct retired, and continued working as a security officer at the former St. Vincent Medical Center and then at Carmel Richmond Nursing Home before his final retirement.

Tom met and married his beloved wife Marie Franzese on May 1, 1955. Marie passed away in June of 2001

In his free time Tom could be found playing Poker in Atlantic City in his younger years and at the Esplanade Senior Living Facility, where he has resided the last 5 years, Everyone lovingly referred to him as "Poker Tom".

Devoted husband of the late Marie Franzese Pellegrino. Loving father of Thomas Pellegrino. Adored father in law of Rosanne Pellegrino. Dear brother

of Rocco Pellegrino. Cherished grandfather of Philip and wife Joanna and Maria Tozzi and her husband Joseph.

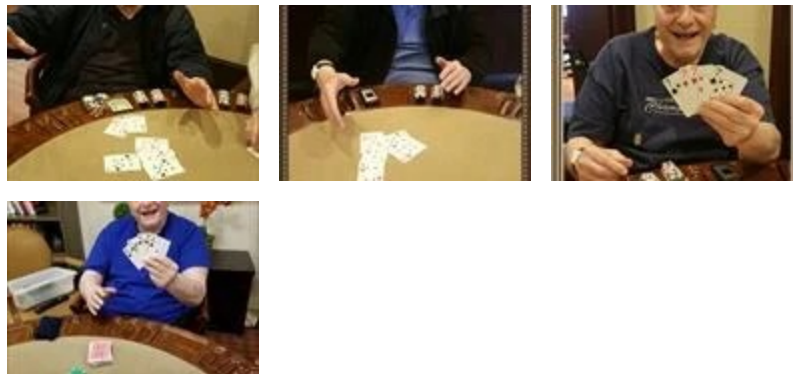
