December 24, 1952 - April 27, 2015

Thomas Auteri, 62, of Eltingville, a retired Fed Ex operations manager, U.S. Marine Corps veteran and steadfast family man, died Monday, April 27, 2015, in Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, Manhattan.

Born and raised in downtown Brooklyn, he graduated from John Jay High School in his native borough. Mr. Auteri served in the U.S. Marine Corps from 1970 to 1972, stationed stateside.

He moved to Huguenot in 1990, and had lived in Eltingville since 2002.

Mr. Auteri had a 25-year career as an operations manager for Federal Express, and retired in 2013.

He was devoted to his family and loved having them around him. They enjoyed spending time in the backyard pool, and he loved to entertain, hosting parties at home for friends and extended family. He also was an avid sports fan, rooting for the New York Mets and Jets, and enjoyed Motown music and visits to Las Vegas.

Mr. Auteri and Judy Catalano first met at a party, but didn't see each other until a year later, when she was at T.J. Bentley's with a cousin visiting from Vegas and they ran into each other. "Don't I know you from somewhere?"

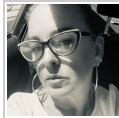

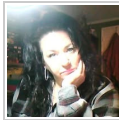
