Thomas W. Mullen, a man whose life was defined by laughter, love, and unwavering dedication to family, passed away on February 26, 2026, at the age of 73. In addition to his sons, daughter-in-law and grandsons, Thomas is survived by his loving sister Debbie and her husband Ralph, as well as his adoring nieces, nephew, and great-nephews, all of whom carry forward his legacy of love and laughter. His family and friends were always at the forefront of his mind, and he never failed to remember a birthday or a special occasion, ensuring everyone felt loved and valued.

Thomas lived for life's simple joys: the thrill of a Rangers or Yankees game, the smooth sound of Frank Sinatra, and the intrigue of a good mob story. Yet, it was the quiet moments that filled his heart the most. Whether he was playing with Duke, or cheering on his grandsons from the sidelines, Thomas was happiest when surrounded by the people he loved.

After a courageous battle with cancer, Thomas spent his final days surrounded by the family he cherished and who cherished him in return. 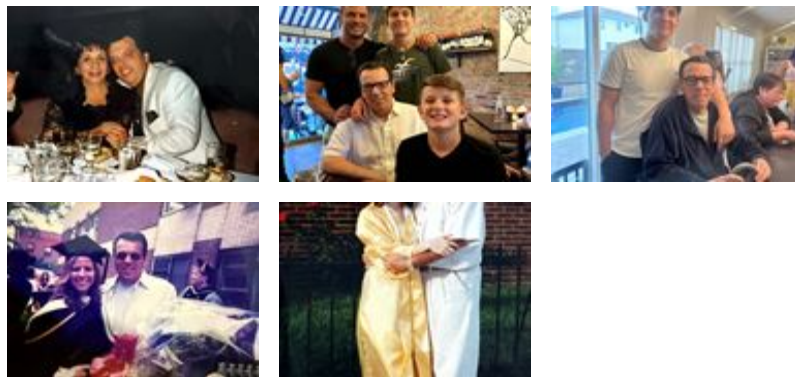
