Vincent Atigna, age 83, passed away on December 31, 2025 at Seaview Nursing Home on Staten Island, NY. He was surrounded by his son Mike and daughter Anna in his last days.

He was born in Brooklyn, NY on August 29, 1942 to Mary and Frank Atigna.

Vincent served in the U.S. Air Force as an Operating Room Specialist at Plattsburgh AFB and was honorably discharged in 1963. He became a New York City Transit Police Officer in 1965, retiring in 1986. Vincent coached Great Kills Little League and Babe Ruth baseball teams for many years in the 1970's and 80's. He enjoyed watching the N.Y. Mets and making yearly trips to Las Vegas.

Vincent was predeceased by his wife Angie and his three sisters Theresa, Maryann and Joan.

He is survived by his daughter Anna, his son Mike, Mike's wife Dawn and his granddaughter Ellie.

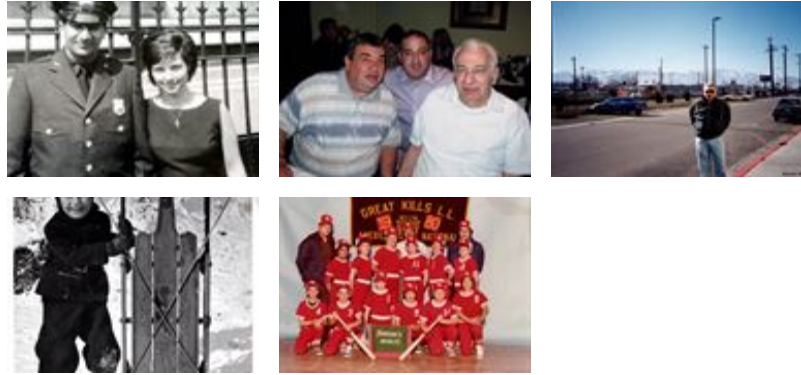
